2. 2023-2024 TDA TXCDBG PROGRAM PUBLIC HEARING

Jill Phinney of Langford Community Management Services told Council and those present about the TDA TxCDBG 2023-2024 and the projects that are eligible for assistance under this program. Taylor Whittaker of the Burton Bridge Ministry was in attendance to ask Council to consider using this program to fund housing rehabilitation and water & sewer infrastructure improvements within the city.
